Icicle Aisle is in the newly mapped and surveyed course of the almost 12 mile Snowy River Passage located on BLM lands (Fort Stanton - Snowy River Cave National Conservation Area). More than eleven miles have now been mapped and about half of that in the last 2-3 years! This has been a totally new and exciting challenge for the cavers and scientists who make up this project.
